

LOTTO GAME RULES

1. PLAYING THE LOTTO GAME

The following are the essential features of the LOTTO game, as approved by the National Lotteries and Gaming Regulatory Board (NLGRB).

- 1.1 LOTTO is a Uganda National Lottery Game in which the Participant selects, or has the Lottery Processing System randomly assign 6 numbers from the range 1 to 52.
- 1.2 Participants of any Uganda National Lottery Game must be at least 18 years of age in order to play and win or claim prizes.
- 1.3 All Uganda National Lottery Tickets issued for this Game shall be clearly identified with the name of the Game "LOTTO" and the date(s) of the Draw(s) for which they are issued.
- LOTTO Draws will be conducted twice a week on Wednesdays and on Saturdays. (Except when those days fall on a Christmas Day as there will not be any Draw conducted on 25 December.)
- 1.5 Participants can purchase LOTTO Tickets on any day of the week during the times when the game is made available for sale by the participating sales channels.
- 1.6 On Draw days Ticket sales will close at 20:30 and the Selection of winning numbers will commence shortly afterwards.
- 1.7 Winning numbers will be published soon after 21:00.
- 1.8 Participants can purchase LOTTO Tickets from any of the following channels during their hours of operation:
 - 1.8.1 Authorised and participating Retail stores.
 - 1.8.2 The Uganda National Lottery Website:



(<u>www.nationallottery.go.ug</u>), Mobi Web and Mobile App (Currently the Mobi Web and the Mobile App platforms are in final development and testing and will be launched in due course); and,

1.8.3 By dialing:

*278# to play via the Uganda National Lottery USSD line

*185# via the Airtel USSD line,

*165# via the MTN USSD line.

- 1.8.4 Authorised Banking and Telco partners via their Websites and Mobile Apps (as and when they become available), and,
- 1.8.5 Any other Alternate Channels that become applicable for the game.
- 1.8.6 Online participants may only register and play using one E-commerce account.
- 1.9 The cost of one Entry/Board for a LOTTO Draw will be UGX 1,000.
- 1.10 The maximum value of all wagers that a Participant can play on LOTTO is limited to UGX 500,000 per day.
- 1.11 All National Lottery tickets and other printed material will be printed in English.
- 1.12 The total numbers to be selected per Entry into any LOTTO Draw shall be 6 numbers (i.e. 6 numbers from the range 1 to 52 which shall be known as the "Main Numbers").
- 1.13 The Participant of the LOTTO Game can choose the 6 numbers in different ways, namely by:
 - 1.13.1 Selecting his/her own personal lucky numbers using a Play Slip; and/or;
 - 1.13.2 By choosing "QUICK PICK" on a Play Slip or by requesting "QUICK PICK(S)" from the Retailer; and/or;
 - 1.13.3 By indicating in person to a Retailer the requested personal lucky numbers which will then be manually entered into the Terminal by the Retail clerk



before being printed on a Ticket, and the Participants must ensure that the Retail clerk captured the correct numbers.

- 1.13.4 Alternatively, a Participant can select their own numbers manually or a random Selection via a "QUICK PICK" using the interfaces on The Uganda National Lottery Website, Mobi Web and Mobile App, USSD, or any authorised Banking and Telecom partners' Websites or Mobile Apps (as and when they become available).
- 1.14 If the Play Slip or Entry is rejected by any Terminal, Website, Mobile App (as and when they become available) or any other channel interface then there is no valid Entry into the Draw.
- 1.15 Only a Ticket (Digital or paper version) with a valid Ticket serial number and recorded on the Central Gaming System, is deemed to be a successful Entry into the Draw. Further, if the Entry is not submitted on the online play channels with a confirmation SMS and a Ticket / Receipt number, the Entry shall not be valid.
- 1.16 If an Entry is not recorded on the Central Gaming System for any particular Draw, the Entry shall not be valid. The system will only generate a Ticket if the Entry is recorded on the Central Gaming System, which will prove to the Participant that their Entry was successful.
- 1.17 If the Participant has insufficient funds in their online wallet, a POP UP message will appear notifying them accordingly.
- 1.18 If no deduction is made from the Participant's online wallet/account, no entry will be processed.
- 1.19 If a deduction is made from the Participants online wallet but no Entry is recorded on the Central Gaming System for any particular game, the Entry shall not be valid. The system will only generate a Ticket if the Entry is recorded on the Central Gaming System, which will prove to the Participant that their Entry was successful. A



Participant will receive notification of a successful ticket purchase via an inbox message to their Participant account. In such a situation, the money deducted from the wallet will be credited back not exceeding 72 hours.

1.20 If an E-wallet remains unused and/or inactive (i.e. lacking transactions) for a consecutive period of nine (9) months, ITHUBA will notify the Lottery Participant at least one month before the end of this period, informing them of the forthcoming suspension of their E-wallet. If no transactions occur after the initial notice, ITHUBA will proceed to block the E-Wallet (account). Within five days of blocking the E-wallet (account), ITHUBA will inform the Lottery Participant accordingly, including instructions on how to reactivate the E-Wallet (account), and should the participant not reactive the account within a period of 6 months, then the funds will be transferred to the Central Bank of Uganda.

2. STATUS OF THESE RULES

- 2.1 These "Rules" are for the LOTTO Game, as approved by the NLGRB.
- 2.2 ITHUBA reserves the right to amend these "Rules" from time to time subject to the approval from the NLGRB.
 - 2.3 These "Rules" should be read in conjunction with:
 - 2.3.1 The Uganda National Lottery Participants Code of Practice; and
 - 2.3.2 The Uganda National Lottery Games General Terms and Conditions which, together, constitute the contractual rights and obligations of ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED to Participants, as may be amended from time to time subject to the approval by the NLGRB.
 - 2.3.3 Participants code of practice and the Uganda National Lottery General Terms and Conditions form part of the Rules.



2.4 In the event of a discrepancy or inconsistency between these "Rules" and the Games General Terms and Conditions and/or the explanations being advised during a purchase, these "Rules" shall prevail.

3. LOTTO PROCEDURES AND DESCRIPTIONS

- 3.1 ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED will make the LOTTO Game available for sale to the public at such cost stipulated under paragraphs 1.9 above, or at an alternative cost as ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED may from time to time determine as approved by the NLGRB.
- 3.2 The Participant may participate in the LOTTO Game in accordance with the following:
 - 3.2.1 By presenting a completed Play Slip to a Retailer with the appropriate wager amount for the number of entries into the Draw(s).
 - 3.2.2 Each LOTTO Play Slip contains 8 Boards labelled A to H. Each Board enables the Participant to make their Selections for 1 Entry into the LOTTO Draw per Board.
 - 3.2.3 Each Selection is made by manually marking 6 numbers on one Board or by manually marking the "QUICK PICK" box.
 - 3.2.4 Entering a Selection of 6 numbers where 6 "Main numbers" will be selected from the range 1 to 52.
 - 3.2.5 Each Play Slip features a Selection grid below the Game Logo, allowing Participants to indicate their preference for playing multiple Draws in advance. By default, the Entry is set for the current draw only (i.e., for 1 Draw). However, Participants can use this grid to play their selected numbers and enter from 2 to 10 consecutive draws in advance.
 - 3.2.6 The completed Play Slip is processed through the Lottery Terminal, which will issue the "Ticket"/Receipt, recording each Selection marked on the Play Slip, including but not limited to other information such as the Draw number(s) and date(s) of the Draw(s);



- 3.2.7 The "Ticket" will have a unique serial number printed on it above a unique bar code for ease of "Ticket" identification and for security purposes.
- 3.2.8 As an alternative option to a Play Slip, a Participant may simply ask the Retail clerk to enter their chosen numbers or to make a QUICK PICK Selection(s) manually into the Terminal on their behalf.
- 3.2.9 Participants may also play LOTTO by selecting a random set of 6 numbers through any Alternate Sales Channel interface where a Participant can purchase an Entry into the LOTTO Draw. The Participant will be issued with a valid Ticket or a Receipt, whichever is applicable through the different platforms of purchasing the Uganda National Lottery Game.
- 3.2.10 When purchasing Tickets online, the Participant will receive confirmation of a Ticket and/or receipt number for each Entry in the form of an SMS and/or an in-box email. In the event that an SMS and/or in-box email is not received, the Entry shall not be valid.
- 3.2.11 ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED, the official licensed operator of the LOTTO game, shall not be held responsible, nor accept any liability whatsoever, in respect to Ticket sales or claims that are made with any third parties after the Draw Ticket sales conclude at 20:30. This non-liability extends until the time the Draw reopens for sales pertaining to the subsequent Draw.
- 3.2.12 The Participant's sole responsibility is to ensure that they engage in transactions only within the official sale times and through authorised channels. ITHUBA does not endorse, validate, or have any affiliation with Ticket sales or claims that are processed outside of the stipulated official times or through unauthorised third parties.
- 3.2.13 Any disputes or issues arising from transactions concluded with third parties after the specified time will not involve ITHUBA in any capacity. ITHUBA disclaims all liabilities arising from such situations.
- 3.2.14 Participants are strongly advised to act with caution and only to purchase Tickets from authorised outlets during the specified times to ensure the validity and legitimacy of their Tickets.



- 3.2.15 By purchasing a LOTTO Ticket, the Participant agrees to be bound by this disclaimer, along with all other game Rules set forth by ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED.
- 3.2.16 LOTTO tickets may be cancelled after being issued (purchased), on condition that:
 - 3.2.16.1 The ticket is returned to the issuing retailer/terminal;
 - 3.2.16.2 The ticket is presented within two hours of the time of purchase, or before the close of ticket sales for the day, or the close of sales time, whichever is the earlier time; and
 - 3.2.16.3 Should the terminal not be able to cancel the ticket, the Retailer will contact the designated Call Centre for assistance.
 - 3.2.16.4 Tickets purchased from the Mobile App and the website cannot be cancelled (as and when they become available).

4. DRAWS

- 4.1 LOTTO Draws will take place on the night of the draw day (i.e. a Wednesday and a Saturday) or such other days from time to time, as may be specified by ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED as approved by the NLGRB.
- 4.2 There will be no Draw on Christmas Day (25 December), however, Ticket sales will remain open, and the Draw will take place on the following Wednesday or Saturday.
- 4.3 For LOTTO, Ticket sales close at 20:30 on the evening of each respective Draw.
- 4.4 The LOTTO Draw will be broadcast at 20:57 on the day of the Draw.
- 4.5 In each draw 7 winning numbers will be drawn using a Random Number Generator system. The 7 winning numbers drawn will consist of 6 "Main numbers" which will be selected from the range 1 to 52 and 1 "BONUS number" which will be selected from the remainder of the numbers in the same range after the first 6 numbers have been drawn.



- 4.6 The winning numbers are then compiled and published soon after 21:00.
- 4.7 Winner results, including the number of winners and winning prize share amounts, will be calculated and published after the completion of the TV Draw show.

5. PRIZE DIVISIONS

WINNING SELECTIONS FOR LOTTO

A Participant who, in respect of the numbers selected on any single Board Entry, matches the 'BONUS number' drawn in addition to two of the first six 'Main numbers' drawn, will be eligible for one of the prizes. For each additional 'Main number' that is drawn and matched by the Participant on the same Board Entry, they will increasingly become eligible for a prize in the highest prize category to which those numbers relate. The 'BONUS number' provides an extra chance for Participants to win prizes and four out of the eight Prize Divisions reward winners who match the 'BONUS number' drawn.

The LOTTO Prize Divisions are detailed as follows:

Prize Division 1 – MATCH 6 (The JACKPOT)

Means that on any single Board/Entry, the Participant has correctly matched all of the first 6 numbers drawn ("MATCH 6").

Prize Division 2 – MATCH 5 + BONUS number

Means that on any single Board/Entry, the Participant has correctly matched 5 of the first 6 numbers drawn and has also matched the 'BONUS number' drawn ("MATCH 5 + BONUS number").

Prize Division 3 – Match 5

Means that on any single Board/Entry, the Participant has correctly matched 5 of the first 6 numbers drawn but has not matched the 'BONUS number' drawn ("MATCH 5").



Prize Division 4 – MATCH 4 + BONUS number

Means that on any single Board/Entry, the Participant has correctly matched 4 of the first 6 numbers drawn and has also matched the 'BONUS number' drawn ("MATCH 4 + BONUS number").

Prize Division 5 – MATCH 4

Means that on any single Board/Entry, the Participant has correctly matched 4 of the first 6 numbers drawn but has not matched the 'BONUS number' drawn ("MATCH 4").

Prize Division 6 – MATCH 3 + BONUS number

Means that on any single Board/Entry, the Participant has correctly matched 3 of the first 6 numbers drawn and has also matched the 'BONUS number' drawn ("MATCH 3 + BONUS number").

Prize Division 7 – MATCH 3

Means that on any single Board/Entry, the Participant has correctly matched 3 of the first 6 numbers drawn but has not matched the 'BONUS number' drawn ("MATCH 3").

Prize Division 8 – MATCH 2 + BONUS number

Means that on any single Board/Entry, the Participant has correctly matched 2 of the first 6 numbers drawn and has also matched the 'BONUS number' drawn ("MATCH 2 + BONUS number").

6. PRIZE POOLS

6.1 Subject to rounding down, the amount allocated by ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED, as approved by the NLGRB, to the Prize Pool Fund for payment of Prize(s) for a Draw ("Prize Fund") shall be 48% of the net fund of Entries into that Draw, or such larger amount as shall be determined by ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED as approved by the NLGRB from time to time.



- 6.2 The Prize Pool Fund is split into 8 different Prize Pools and allocated for each of the 8 Prize Divisions described previously in section 5.
- 6.3 The Prize Pools with their percentage allocation of funds is shown in the Prize Table in section 7.
- 6.4 There are two types of prize payment calculations applied to the Prize Pools:
 - 6.4.1 Pari-Mutuel prize pools apply to Prize Divisions 1 through 6. This means that the Prize Pool designated for each Prize Division will be divided among all winning Ticket holders in that prize Division based on the number of winning Tickets they possess. For instance, if there is an allocation of UGX 600 million for the LOTTO Jackpot Prize Division and there are two winning Tickets, each winning Ticket holder will receive UGX 300 million.
 - 6.4.2 Fixed prize amounts guarantee that a prize never falls below a certain amount regardless of how many winners there are. Fixed prize amounts are paid for winners in Prize Division 7 and 8. The fixed prizes amounts payable per winning share are:
 - 6.4.2.1 UGX 10,000 per winning Entry for Prize Division 7, and
 - 6.4.2.2 UGX 4,000 per winning Entry for Prize Division 8.
 - 6.4.3 Fixed prizes are calculated prior to Pari-Mutuel Division calculations.
- 6.5 The allocation of the Prize Fund to each of the Pari-Mutuel Prize Divisions, as approved by the NLGRB, shall be in accordance with the following provisions:
 - 6.5.1 If the Division 1 (Jackpot) in a LOTTO Draw is not won then the prize pool allocated for this Division will be rolled over to the Division 1 (Jackpot) Division in the next LOTTO Draw by default.
 - 6.5.2 If there are no winners in a particular Prize Division between Prize Divisions 2 to 6, then the Prize Pool for that Prize Division will roll down (be added to) the Prize Division immediately below it, e.g. If there are no winners in Prize Division 4 then the Prize Pool for that Division is added to the Prize Pool for Prize Division 5.



- 6.5.3 In the Unlikely event that there are no winners in Prize Division 6 then the accumulated Prize Fund in that Prize Division will roll over (be added to) the Prize Division 1 for the next draw.
- 6.6 All winning prize share amounts shall be rounded to the nearest UGX 100 as follows: e.g. UGX 155 shall be rounded up to UGX 200, and UGX 143 shall be UGX 100.
- 6.7 Breakage (The amount left over after any rounding calculation) from any LOTTO Prize Division, will roll over to the same Prize Division in the next Draw.

7. LOTTO – Odds of Winning per Entry and Prize Structure

The following table, based on 20,358,520 Tickets/Entries sold, is for illustrative purposes to show the odds of winning and the allocation of the Prize Fund as approved by the NLGRB.

The holder of a winning Selection may win in only one prize category per Board/Entry in connection with the Winning Numbers Drawn in each Draw and shall be entitled to the prize for the highest prize category won by those numbers in each Draw (regardless of the actual Prize value).

8. WINNING RESULTS AND PRIZE CLAIMS/CHECKING RESULTS FOR WINNING TICKETS

- 8.1 Winning numbers are announced on the TV Draw Show for LOTTO on the night of the Draws. (Wednesdays and Saturdays except Christmas Day).
- 8.2 Full Draw details are posted on the National Lottery Website, Mobile Apps (as and when they become available) and Social Media pages after 21:00.
- 8.3 The information posted includes but is not limited to:
 - 8.3.1 The winning numbers in order that they were drawn and in numerical order.
 - 8.3.2 The number of winners per prize Division.
 - 8.3.3 The prize amounts won per winner.
 - 8.3.4 The jackpot rollover amount, and
 - 8.3.5 The estimated or guaranteed jackpot amount for the next Draw.
- 8.4 Participants can also check to see if they have a winning Ticket by handing their Ticket(s) to Retail Lottery clerks who can validate the Ticket details using the lottery terminal. Winning Tickets will be identified by the lottery agent by scanning or manually entering the Ticket serial number.
- 8.5 Participants can also obtain more information or assistance with any of the National Lottery Games including checking results, by calling the Player Helpline (Toll Free) on 0800 334433 between 07:00 – 23:00 Mondays to Saturdays and 07:00 – 21:00 on Sundays.



HOW TO CLAIM A PRIZE

- 8.6 Winning Tickets must be claimed within 180 days of the date of the Draw or else they will expire.
- 8.7 Unclaimed prize monies from the expired winning tickets will be used to fund guaranteed jackpots.
- 8.8 Winners can claim their prize amounts from authorised Lottery Retailers according to the table below:

- 8.9 The requirements for claiming at an ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED Office include the winning Ticket, and or a valid winning SMS/Email confirmation, the winner's National Identification card or passport, and proof of valid E-wallet account (limited to the thresholds determined from time to time) or bank account in which the proof should not be older than 3 months.
- 8.10 For all paper based Tickets it is mandatory that the owner and winner of the Ticket write their name, National card or passport number and sign the back of the Ticket.



9. GLOSSARY

The following words and terms, if and whenever they appear in these Game Rules, shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly states otherwise:

9.1 Alternate Sales Channel

The point-of-sale other than the Lottery Terminal where a Participant can purchase an Entry into the LOTTO Game. The Participant will be issued with a valid paper version or a digital version of a LOTTO Ticket. Other points-of-sale include the Uganda National Lottery Website, In-lane till points (at selected Retailer outlets), handheld devices, ATMs, Mobi Apps, mobile phones any other additional channels from time to time.

9.2 Board

Means the Selection of numbers on the Play Slip or online screen for a Uganda National Lottery Game as per these Rules.

9.3 Breakage

The remaining funds in a Prize Division after allocating rounded-off winnings.

9.4 **Cancellation of a Ticket**

"Cancellation of a Ticket" refers to the process by which a purchased lottery ticket is voided or invalidated according to the conditions of Cancellation after the transaction has been completed but before the draw takes place.



9.5 Central Computer System

The computer system/s used by ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED to operate the LOTTO Game.

9.6 Constituent Lottery

Any lottery conducted by ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED that forms part of the Uganda National Lottery.

9.7 Draw

The process which culminates in the Selection of a set of randomly generated winning numbers by the Random Number Generator for the LOTTO Game.

9.8 Entry

A transaction by which a Participant's Entry into the LOTTO Game has been recorded as an Entry on the Central Computer System.

9.9 E-Wallet

The online purchase/payment solution and/or system application owned by a 3rd Party, but operated by ITHUBA, to store payment information and allow Lottery Participants to securely make purchases/payment for lottery related products and services without using cash or card.

9.10 Game

The Game of LOTTO as detailed in these Rules, which shall include any Game, scheme, arrangement, system, plan, promotional competition or device which comprises a Constituent Lottery.

9.11 ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED

The Uganda National Lottery Operator licensed under the Lotteries & Gaming Act of 2016, as amended, to operate, conduct and promote the Uganda National Lottery and Constituent Lottery Games in Uganda.



9.12 Lottery Processing System

The transaction processing system that controls the operation of the LOTTO Games consisting of the Central Computer System and the Lottery Terminals or other access points.

9.13 National Lottery

The Uganda National Lottery Games licensed to ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED to operate in Uganda.

9.14 Pari-Mutuel Prize Pool Fund

The remaining Prize Fund that will be allocated to Prize Divisions 1 to 6 in the LOTTO Game after the fixed prizes have been calculated for Prize Divisions 7 and 8.

9.15 Participant

A member of the public (a Particpant/player) over the age of 18 who purchases or otherwise acquires a LOTTO Ticket.

9.16 Play Slip

A preformatted form bearing the numbers from which a Participant can make his/her Selection to make an Entry into the LOTTO Game.

9.17 Prize Division

The prize tiers a Participant may win a Prize from according to the defined matching criteria set forth in the relevant Prize Division.

9.18 Prize Pool

The amount allocated to each Prize Division category.



9.19 **LOTTO**

LOTTO is a Uganda National Lottery Game in which the Participant selects, or has the Lottery Processing System randomly assign 6 numbers from the range 1 to 52.

9.20 Prize

A Prize won by a Participant in the LOTTO Games. The Prizes are fixed/ guaranteed or Pari-Mutuels Prizes.

9.21 Prize Fund

Shall be a percentage of the net sales of Entries into that Draw or such larger amount as shall be determined by ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED, in its sole and absolute discretion, as approved by the NLGRB from time to time allocated to the LOTTO Game.

9.22 Prize Structure

The number, value and odds of winning Prizes for the LOTTO Game as determined by ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED and approved by the NLGRB from time to time.

9.23 **QUICK PICK**

A system function to support the Participant in the LOTTO Game wherein a set of numbers are selected on a random basis by the Lottery Processing System on behalf of the Participant. This can be requested directly from the Retailer or selected on the Participant's Play Slip or other Sales Channel interface.

9.24 Receipt

A Uganda National Lottery receipt issued through a Retailer by the Terminal (or Alternate Sales Channel) to a Participant which records a Participant's Entry or Entries into the LOTTO Game and such other information as may be determined by ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED and approved by the NLGRB from time to time.



9.25 Retailer

Any person, firm or entity authorised by ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED to sell LOTTO Entries and/or to pay certain Prizes in respect of a Valid Winning Ticket of the LOTTO Games.

9.26 Rules

These Game Rules for LOTTO as detailed herein, and as may be amended by ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED and approved by the NLGRB from time to time.

9.27 Selection

One set of six numbers chosen by a Participant within one Entry on a Board or one set of six numbers resulting from QUICK PICK or one set of six numbers chosen by a Participant which may be keyed in manually by a Retailer and which is recorded on a Ticket issued in accordance with these Rules.

9.28 Serial Number

The unique number assigned by ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED's 'Central Computer System' and printed on a Ticket which, subject to these Rules, provides for the verification of the Ticket as a Valid Winning Ticket or otherwise. The Serial Number may be in the form of digits, a bar code or any other form.

9.29 Site

The website of the Uganda National Lottery: (www.nationallottery.go.ug).

9.30 SMS

A method used to confirm numbers played online and also the value of winnings post Draws of the numbers played.



9.31 Terminal

The point-of-sale terminals with an on-line connection to the Central Computer System and which shall be used for the issuance of valid Ticket(s) and for the validation of Valid Winning Ticket(s).

9.32 Ticket

Ticket(s) issued by a Terminal and sold by an authorised Retailer in an authorised manner or sold via Alternate Sales Channels that indicates the unique number that will serve as evidence for Prize claim.

9.33 Ticket Validation Requirements

ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED's validation requirements for Ticket(s) representing winning numbers for that specific Draw.

9.34 Valid Winning Ticket

A winning LOTTO Ticket which meets all ITHUBA UGANDA LIMITED's LOTTO Ticket Validation Requirements, from time to time.

9.35 Winning Selection

A Selection which entitles a Participant to a Prize in the category applicable to the randomly selected winning number/s.

In these Rules, the singular shall include the plural and vice versa, as the context may require.
